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VIVA Levels the Playing Field

- The Virtual Library of Virginia (VIVA) is the consortium of the 71 academic libraries within the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- For 25 years, VIVA has created significant cost savings through cooperative purchasing and resource sharing.
- Since 2018, VIVA has expanded its programs to provide direct support to open and affordable initiatives in Virginia.

VIVA'S OPEN AND AFFORDABLE COURSE CONTENT INITIATIVE

IN 2019, VIVA launched the Open Grants Program awarding up to \$30,000 to teams to adopt, adapt, or create course materials that are free to students



Lesson #1: The Need is Great

Spring, 2019: 61 applications, requesting \$810,612

Fall, 2019: 44 applications, requesting \$637,765

Spring, 2020: 41 applications, requesting, \$563,986

TOTAL REQUEST: \$2.012 million

AWARDED: \$578,189

ANTICIPATED SAVINGS: \$15 million over five years

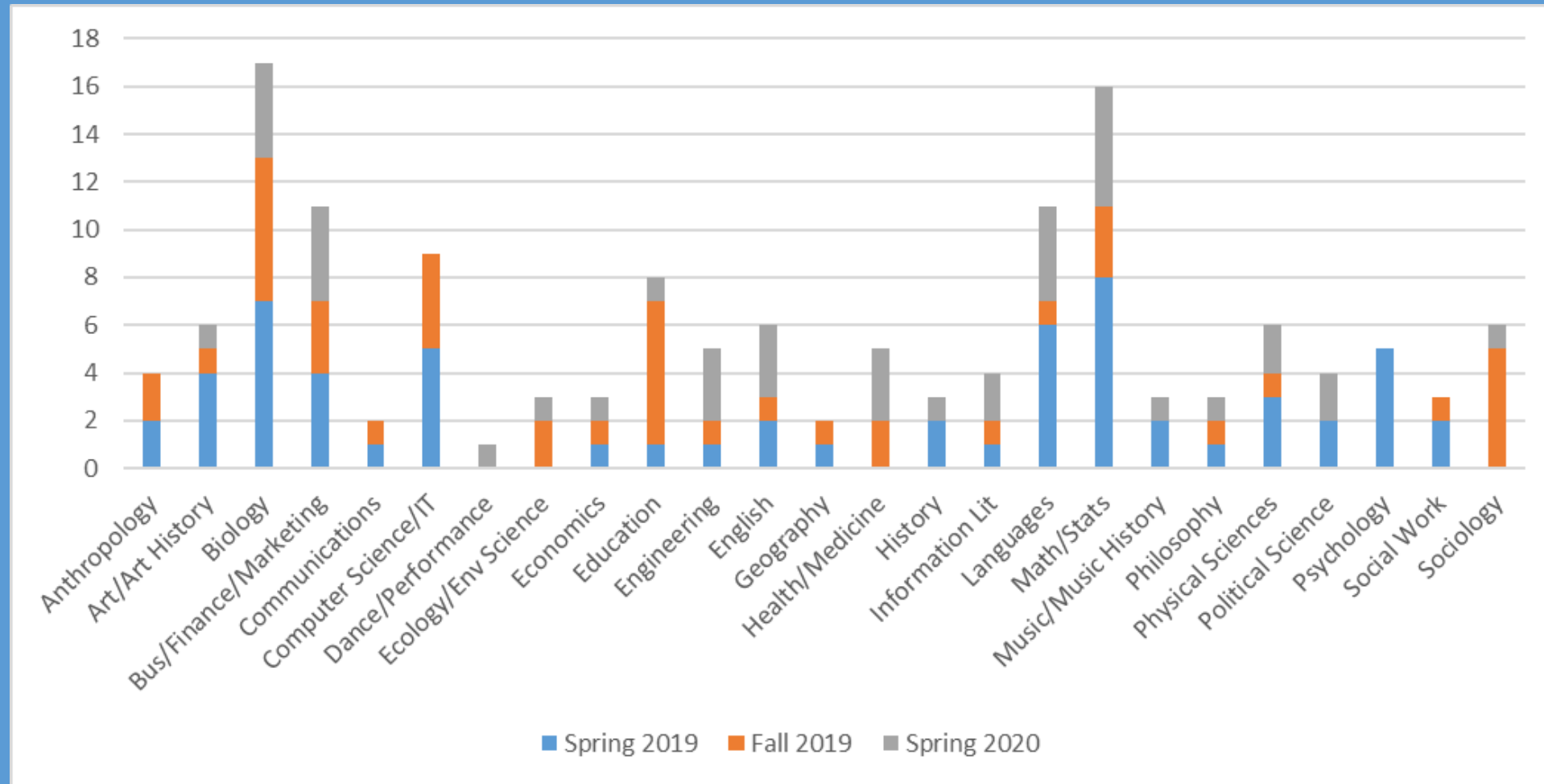


Lesson #2: Benefits Go Beyond Savings

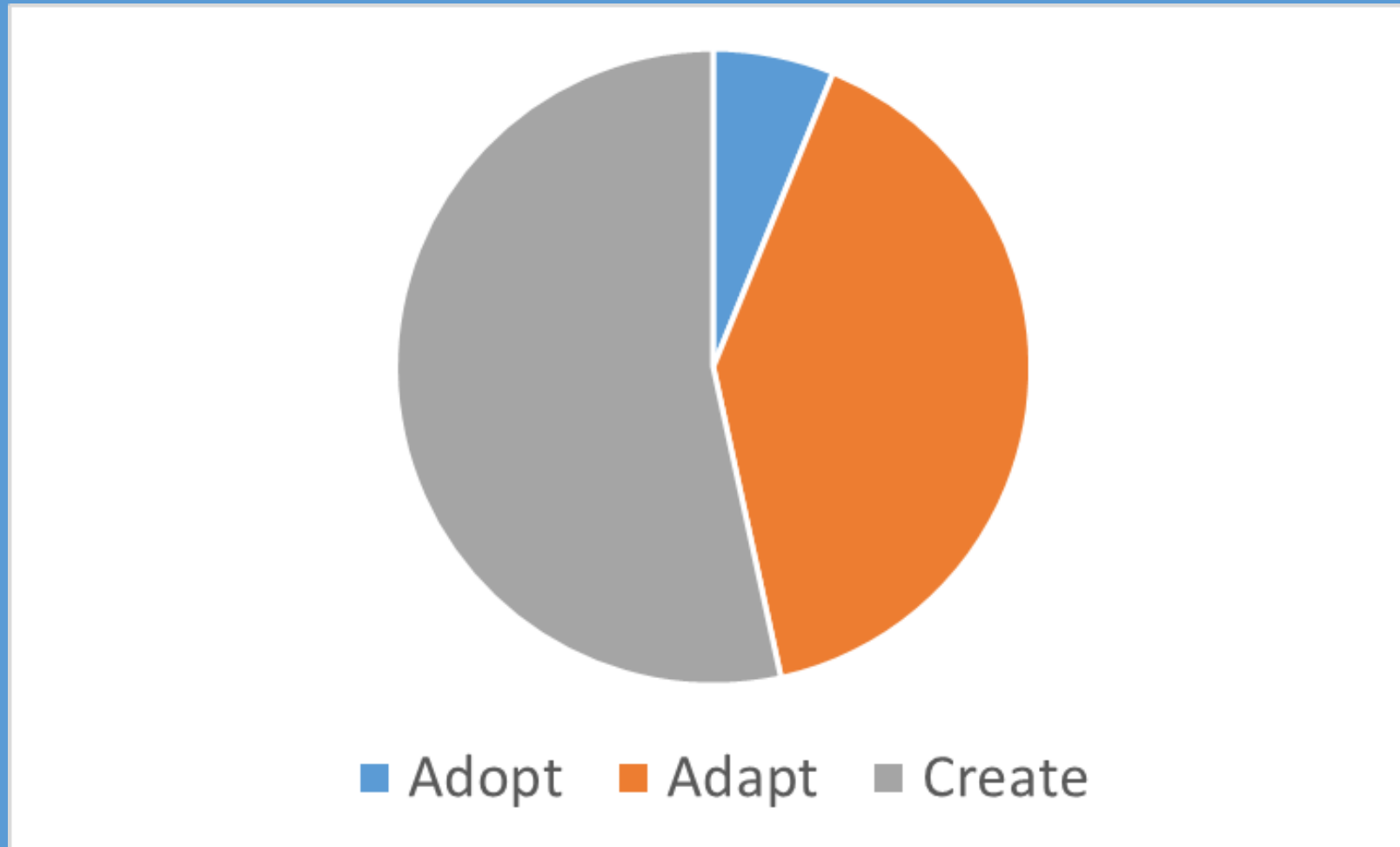
- Meets classroom and pedagogical needs
